AIFF adopts new format for Super Cup from 2024-25

New Delhi, Feb 7: The Super Cup, India's premier knock-out football tournament and which also offers a spot in the AFC Champions League 2, is set to adopt a new format in the 2024-25 season, similar to England's FA Cup.

The All India Football Federation (AIFF) in its calendar for the upcoming season has slotted the Super Cup in the October 1, 2024 to May 15, 2025 window.

The Super Cup, which replaced the country's top knock-out tournament Federation Cup in 2018, normally has a duration of less than a month.

"The AIFF wants the Super Cup in FA Cup (of England) style from this season. That is why it has a window of more than seven months," an AIFF source said.

The Super Cup will run almost concurrently with the top-tier Indian Super

League (ISL) and the second tier I-League in the 2024-25 season.

The details of the tournament, including the exact format, will be announced later.

The Football Association Cup of England is an annual knockout domestic competition. First played during the 1871-72 season, it is the oldest national football competition in the world. The FA Cup is open to all clubs from 10 tiers of the footballing pyramid in England, including the Premier League (PL) sides.

The competition starts with qualifying rounds featuring the lower division teams, with the higher ranked clubs slotting in at the advanced stages based on league hierarchy.

The Super Cup, organised by the AIFF, is open to all ISL and I-League clubs, the top two division of the

domestic league system.

The last Super Cup was held in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, in January, with 16 clubs competing in the group stage.

All the ISL clubs directly entered in the group stage while the I-League sides played the qualifiers for the four remaining spots.

During the group stage, the clubs were divided into four groups of four teams, playing against each other in a single round-robin format. The team with the most points in a group qualifies to the semifinals.

The champion team gets a spot in the AFC Champions League 2, the second tier of the Asian club competition system, just like FA Cup winning side books a berth in the UEFA Europa League.

The AIFF also announced that the 11th edition of the ISL will kick off on September 14

and will run till April 30, 2025, while the I-League will be played between October 19 and April 30.

The senior competition calendar for the 2024-25 season will begin with the Duran Cup, Asia's oldest tournament, scheduled from July 26 to August 31.

The 78th National Football Championship for the Santosh Trophy will be held from November 5 to 15 (Group Stage) and December 1 to 15 (Final Round).

The 29th Senior Women's National Football Championship will take place in September (Group Stage) and October (Final Round).

The Indian Women's League will be held from October 25, 2023-April 30, 2024.

All the senior leagues are set to finish by the end of April next year, it was decided in the AIFF executive committee.

Sachin, Uday take India to U19 World Cup final

Benoni, Feb 7: Fuelled by splendid fifties by Sachin Dhas and captain Uday Saharan, defending champions India battled past South Africa by two wickets to storm into the final, their fifth consecutive, of the ICC Under-19 World Cup in Benoni on Tuesday.

Dhas (96, 95 balls, 11x4, 1x6) and Saharan (81, 124, 6x4), who were India's guiding forces in the last match against Nepal with a hundred each, garnered 171 runs for the fifth wicket as India hunted down the target of 245 with just seven balls to spare.

India will face either Australia or Pakistan in the summit clash to be played at this venue on Sunday, searching for their sixth trophy in the marquee event.

But the beginning of India's chase resembled a debris yard, losing four wickets for just 32 runs in the 12th over.

The South African new-ball bowler Kwena Maphaka jolted India in the first ball of their innings, dismissing Adarsh Singh with a nasty climbing delivery that the batter had no choice other than snicking to wicket-keeper Lhuan-dre Pretorius.

His partner Tristan Luus soon joined the fun with the wickets of Musheer Khan, Arshin Kulkarni and Priyanshu Moliya as all three India batters were indecisive



outside the off-stump while hanging their bats to dry.

But the Indians found their saviours in Dhas and Saharan, who dished out innings of vastly contrasting nature and tempo.

Earlier, South Africa posted 244 for 7 riding on the 81 runs in the last 10 overs with the help of Tristan Luus who scored a cameo to provide the final push.

South Africa were finding it difficult to up the ante in the middle overs with Richard Seletswane getting stuck as the Indian spinners put a tight lease on the batsman.

Seletswane could gather only 25 off 75 balls after Pretorius gave a good start, but he turned the heat on India to score 64.

For India, the spinners stood out as Saumy Pandey and Musheer Khan combined to bowl 20 overs for just 81 runs while picking up three wickets.

Earlier, India skipper Uday Saharan won the toss and elected to bowl first. He wanted to utilize the early movement on offer. This was the first time India elected to bowl after winning the toss in the tournament.

Raj Limbani struck early when he accounted for the dangerous Steve Stolk. The trigger-happy batsman hit two fours and a six during his brief stay but went after a wide one and nicked one behind the stumps.

South Africa's other opener, Lhuan-dre Pretorius opened arms after this loss and hit a flurry of boundaries.

Despite losing David Teeger (0) to a brilliant inswinger from Limbani, the Proteas were situated at a healthy 55/2 at the end of the first Powerplay.

India spinners were able to bring down the scoring rate thereafter. Merely 63 runs came between overs 11-30.

The pressure finally got to Pretorius, who tried to hoick Musheer Khan over mid-wicket but was held at short mid-wicket.

Abhishek Murugan took an exceptional catch, holding on to a ball that was racing past him with both hands.

Seletswane and Oliver Whitehead tried to pick the scoring rate with a range of attacking strokes, but Saharan stuck to his spinners. This yielded Whitehead's wicket at the end of the 40th over.

Seletswane was joined by skipper Juan James in the 43rd over. The South Africa innings picked pace under their guidance, and the team became the first side to cross 200 against India in the tournament.

Soon after signing the executive order, Murphy announced more than 40 members to the New Jersey-India Commission, headed by Wesley Mathews, a former US diplomat.

"I am honoured to establish the New Jersey-India Commission to strengthen the cultural and economic ties between New Jersey and India for generations to come," Murphy said.

"Following my visit to India in 2019, we have been committed to strengthening

our relationship, building on the overlapping economic strengths that New Jersey and India have long shared," he said.

"We take immense pride in the contributions of our vast Indian immigrant population and, through this commission, we can ensure that we seize a new century of opportunities to grow together and pioneer new possibilities," Murphy said.

The commission aims to promote cultural and educational exchanges between New Jersey and India and sustainable long-term economic growth.

"Our partnership with New Jersey is unique in several ways," said Consul General of India Binaya Srikanta Pradhan. "It is a potential story of dynamic convergence and confluence of India's economic resilience, presence of a highly successful Indian-American community and America's spirit of innovation, fostering a landscape ripe with opportunities across sectors," he said.

Murphy's initiative to establish the New Jersey-India Commission would add strength to already existing high level of economic engagement in terms of over USD10 billion trade with New Jersey or several two-way investments, Pradhan said.

"This would also give a boost to the strong people-to-people connect that exists between India and New Jersey including in areas of education and knowledge partnership. We also look forward to Governor Murphy's visit to India in the near future to take forward our partnership to new heights," he said.

India is New Jersey's second-largest foreign direct investor and the majority of its immigrant population hails from that country.

In September of 2019, Murphy led an economic mission trip to India, fostering economic relations and securing over 1,200 new jobs by expanding the presence of three Indian companies within New Jersey.

Modi highlights huge potential in solar segment

Goa, Feb 7: Highlighting that the newly proposed rooftop solarisation scheme would make one crore families self-reliant in the energy sector, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said there is a great potential for investment in the entire solar value chain.

In his inaugural address at India Energy Week 2024 in Goa, the Prime Minister noted that India's solar energy installed capacity in the past decade has grown by more than 20 times.

"Today, India ranks fourth in the world in renewable energy installed capacity," he said while stating that 40% of India's installed capacity comes from non-fossil fuels.

In her interim Budget speech last week, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced a rooftop solarization scheme to cover one crore households and enable them to get up to 300 units free electricity every month.

Outlining the government's commitment to transforming rural economies through the Waste to Wealth Management model, the Prime Minister highlighted the government's efforts towards sustainable development.

"We are working towards the installation of 5,000 compressed biogas plants in India," he announced.

Touching upon India's stride in the green hydrogen sector, Modi highlighted the National Green Hydrogen Mission which will pave the way for India becoming a center of hydrogen production and export.

He expressed confidence that India's green energy sector can make both investors and industries a sure shot winner.

Noting that India Energy Week 2024 is taking place at a significant time period when India's GDP rate crossed 7.5% in the first six months of the financial year, the Prime Minister said that the growth rate is higher than the global growth estimate making India the fastest growing economy in the world.

"Economic experts around the world believe that India will soon become the 3rd largest economy in the

world," Modi said and emphasized the expanding scope of the energy sector in India's growth story.

The Prime Minister noted that India is the world's third largest energy, oil and LPG consumer. Furthermore, he said India is the fourth largest LNG importer and refiner along with the fourth largest automobile market.

He noted rising production of domestic gas due to the government's reforms and the country

is making efforts to take the percentage of gas in the primary energy mix from 6 to 15%.

"This will see an investment of about 67 billion dollars in the next 5-6 years," he informed.

He also underlined rising demand of electric vehicles (EVs) in the country. He also talked about the estimates of doubling of the nation's energy demand by 2045.

Addressing global environmental concerns, Prime Minister Modi

remarked, "Despite being home to 17% of the world's population, India's carbon emission share is only 4%." He added, "We are committed to further improving our energy mix by focusing on the development of environmentally sensitive energy sources."

The Prime Minister reiterated India's goal to achieve Net Zero Emissions by 2070.

New Bangla FM Mahmud in India for wide talks

New Delhi, Feb 7: External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar is scheduled to hold wide-ranging talks with his Bangladeshi counterpart Hasan Mahmud on Wednesday that is expected to focus on reviewing overall bilateral cooperation and exploring ways to boost the ties further.

Mahmud is visiting India from February 6 to 9 in his first bilateral foreign trip since

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina came to power for a fifth term after a landslide victory in the parliamentary elections last month.

In New Delhi, Mahmud is expected to meet Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal as well.

"This will be his first bilateral visit abroad as foreign minister after swearing in of the new government in Bangladesh," the Ministry

of External Affairs (MEA) said.

"The visit reflects the high importance and priority both countries attach to their bilateral relationship," it said in a statement.

The Ministry said Jaishankar and Mahmud will review the progress in wide-ranging areas of bilateral relations and "chart out the agenda for future engagement".

"They will also

exchange views on sub-regional, regional and multilateral issues of common interest," it said.

It is learnt that Mahmud would request the Indian government to ensure a steady supply of food items to Bangladesh, especially during the month of Ramadan.

On Friday, the Bangladesh foreign minister will travel to Kolkata.

Houthis warn Israel of escalating Red Sea attacks

Sanaa, Feb 7: Leader of Yemen's Houthi group, Abdul Malik al-Houthi, on Tuesday vowed to escalate attacks in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden if the conflict in Gaza continues.

"I warn them (the United States, Britain and Israel) that they must stop their aggression against Gaza and stop their siege, otherwise we will seek to escalate more and more attacks," al-Houthi said in a televised speech aired by his group's TV channel al-Masirah.

He made the speech to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the killing of his elder brother, Hussein Badreddin al-Houthi, the founder of the armed group

who was killed during clashes with the Yemeni government army in 2004 in the Houthi stronghold of northern Saada province.

Earlier in the day, the group claimed responsibility for launching attacks on a U.S. navy ship and a British commercial vessel in the Red Sea. "We will launch more," al-Houthi said, noting that his armed group has already disrupted the international shipping.

The U.S. navy said on social media platform X that they intercepted the Houthi attack, while the British commercial vessel reported to the UK Maritime Trade Operations agency that

a missile passed past its deck and caused slight damage to the vessel's bridge windows, while the vessel continued sailing.

The Houthis have escalated its attacks in the Red Sea since mid-November last year. In response, the U.S.-British maritime coalition launched dozens of

airstrikes targeting Houthi sites in several Yemeni provinces.

The Houthi top officials said the U.S.-British airstrikes had no impact on the group's military capabilities and would not deter them from launching further attacks on the Red Sea shipping line.

68 tonnes of ammonia leaked from 15 minutes in Ennore plant accident: Experts

Chennai, Feb 7: About 67.63 tonnes of ammonia got leaked in 15 minutes during the gas leak accident at the Coromandel Fertilizer Plant in Ennore on December 26 and none of the 19 ammonia sensors installed at the plant detected the leak. The shocking details were revealed in a report filed by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) before the southern bench of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) in Chennai on Tuesday.

Experts said if such huge quantity of ammonia got discharged directly into the atmosphere, it could have had fatal consequences. "The fact that the leaked ammonia got dissolved in the sea is a blessing in disguise. If it would have got released into the air directly, there would have been devastating consequences," said a former official of the environment department.

The NGT had initiated suo motu hearing in the case based on a TNIE report dated December 27. The bench had earlier directed the TNPCB and Coromandel International Limited (CIL) to file a detailed report on the incident.

The state government had already accepted

the recommendations of a technical committee constituted to ascertain the cause of the gas leak.

The TNPCB had told the bench that CIL had not carried out safety checks as per prescribed norms and cracks got exposed only when pressure increases in the pipeline during pre-cooling process. In response, the CIL has

filed an affidavit before the NGT on Tuesday. The bench said the failure to notice the pipeline damage lies with the CIL. The pipeline had burst as the pressure increased and it would be right to call it a pipeline burst and not a leak, the bench said. "This is not an adversarial litigation. CIL shouldn't just counter the

arguments of TNPCB. A detailed explanation should be provided by the unit," the bench told the CIL's counsel.

Meanwhile, residents of 33 protesting villages staged a road roko in Ennore on Tuesday. The Ennore Makkal Paathukappu Kuzhu urged government to accept the people's demand to shut the plant.

NGO gets affiliation to run residential school for children battling cancer

Chennai, Feb 7: Children battling cancer often face the harsh reality of missing out on years of school. In this regard, for the first time in the country, the state government has extended affiliation to a school run specifically for children undergoing cancer treatment.

CanKids KidsCan's CanShala, a residential hospital facility in T Nagar, has been affiliated with the government model school in Nandanam, enabling kids to pursue their education while receiving treatment. The NGO signed an MoU to this effect with the school education department in September 2022.

One of the school's students, S Jeevanandham, received his cancer diagnosis two years ago,

when he was in Class 9. "I was relieved I did not have to sacrifice a year of my education. The support I received enabled me to pursue my studies alongside treatment," he said.

At present, the school accommodates 24 children at the residential facility, apart from the day scholars. Those undergoing treatment will receive personalised timetables tailored to their medical schedule. Notably, the T Nagar school is the second CanShala branch, the first one being situated in Mumbai where it operates in collaboration with the municipal corporation.

Speaking during the school's inaugural event on Tuesday, School Education Minister Anbil Mahesh Poyyamozhi said

the initiative will help the children reintegrate back into their schools post-treatment.

"We have been working with kids affected by cancer in Tamil Nadu since 2016. The CanShala school is an extension of the government model school and the students will receive all benefits afforded to government school students. The teachers, aided by the model school, will help them with their own timetable. Apart from subjects, students and parents will be educated on the late side effects of cancer treatment. The children will also be regularly followed-up on after discharge," said Latha Mani, regional head of the NGO.

AIADMK begins poll talks with PMK, DMDK

Chennai, Feb 7: AIADMK led by Edappadi K Palaniswami has begun "preliminary" talks with its erstwhile allies, PMK and DMDK, for the Lok Sabha polls. Former AIADMK minister and Rajya Sabha MP C Ve Shanmugam called on PMK founder S Ramadoss at his Thailapuram residence in Tindivanam late Monday evening. The development comes even as PMK and DMDK are negotiating with BJP as well.

Incidentally, Ramadoss had avoided meeting AIADMK leaders despite their attempts to strike

a deal for the Erode bypoll in February last year.

"The preliminary discussion with Ramadoss was cordial and the AIADMK leadership is positive about the outcome. The leaders are also holding talks with DMDK. EPS will strike a deal with the prospective allies within 10 days," said a senior leader, seeking anonymity.

Insiders say both PMK and DMDK are keen on a Rajya Sabha seat each and point out it was a legitimate demand for firming up electoral ties. AIADMK has 66 MLAs and can elect two RS

MPs next year when six vacancies arise.

PMK, which returned to AIADMK alliance after a decade for the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, has struck a poll deal for seven seats, largely in the northern region, and a RS seat for Anbumani Ramadoss, when his tenure ends next year.

Senior leaders say Parliamentary constituencies such as Dharmapuri and Salem could be easily won by the AIADMK-PMK alliance, given their clout among kongu vellalars and vanniars in the belt.

Sundaram Finance registers 24% rise in net profit

Chennai, Feb 7: Sundaram Finance Ltd. (SFL) has reported a 24 per cent increase in its standalone net profit of Rs.300 crore for the quarter ended December 31, 2023, when compared with a net profit of Rs.243 crore in the year-ago quarter, aided by strong growth in income.

The board of the company has declared an interim dividend of Rs.14 per share (140%) for 2023-24.

The Chennai-headquartered NBFC's interest income grew by 33 per cent to Rs.1,195 crore in the December 2023 quarter (Rs.897 crore in the year-ago quarter), while total income grew by 34 per cent to Rs.1,352 crore when compared with Rs.1,011 crore.

Finance costs were higher at Rs.694 crore compared with Rs.458 crore in Q2FY23. Total expenses stood at Rs.962 crore when compared with Rs.692 crore in Q2FY23.

Disbursements in the December 2023 quarter rose 15 per cent to

Rs.6,524 crore compared with Rs.5,653 crore a year ago.

"Q3 activity in the automotive space was well below expectations of the festival period, with several asset classes declining year-on-year and others growing in single digits. Despite this, Team Sundaram has delivered a tremendous performance," said Rajiv Lochan, Managing Director of the Company.

For the nine months ended December 31, 2023, the company's net profit grew 23 per cent to Rs.948 crore when compared with Rs.772 crore in the same period the previous year.

Interest income was higher at Rs.3,283 crore (Rs.2,551 crore), while disbursements rose 27

per cent to Rs.19,954 crore (Rs.15,707 crore in 9M FY23), with all asset classes and geographies witnessing significant growth.

Harsha Viji, Executive Vice Chairman of the Company, said it had delivered a strong nine months and Q3 of FY24 despite lower-than-expected economic activity during the quarter. "Assets under management grew by 26% to a new high of Rs.42,172 crore; net stage 3 assets closed at 1.02 per cent over the prior year period," he added.

Nauseating smell turns hell for Kovai residents

Much has been said and written about the bad odour emanating from lorries loaded with garbage passing through Karumbukkadai, Kurichi, Podanur to Vellalore dump yard on the outskirts of Coimbatore city. fault with the sanitary department officials when garbage collection has been entrusted with a private party.

It is learnt that about 200 garbage vehicles are under repair resulting in garbage collection hitting a roadblock. Now, the SOs and SIs are trying to set things right by getting the vehicles repaired by spending from their pockets. Seems like there isn't a conducive work atmosphere in the Corporation as the sanitary department officials have loads of grievances. It needs two hands to make a sound. Better for the people at the helm to ensure things are set right before it goes from bad to worse.
